Prof. Dr. Supphasin Thaweesak, Vice-Dean for Strategic Planning, Research, and International Affairs and Dr. Suparat Sukwisut Assistant Dean, convened a meeting to discuss the development of a new interdisciplinary graduate program. The meeting included a collaborative exchange of ideas and insights with experts and distinguished scholars from various fields, including Assoc. Prof. Dr. Nakorn Indra-Payoong (Faculty of Logistics), Dr. Sirichet Rattanachittawat (Faculty of Agricultural Technology), Asst. Prof. Dr. Salil Chanroj (Faculty of Science), Assoc. Prof. Dr. Boonyadist Vongsak (Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences), and Dr. Suchiwa Pan-on Vongsak (Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences). 
