

Key topics covered during the session included:


- Suggestions to expand application rounds to increase flexibility for prospective students



On July 9, 2025, the Graduate School of Burapha University organized the GRD Canvas: Paint your Research Masterpiece event under the theme “Hunting for Ideas, Winning the Grant! Pro Research Proposal Writing Techniques” via Zoom Meeting. The session was formally opened with a welcome address by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Witawat Jangiam, Dean of the Graduate School.

The event was greatly honored by the presence of two distinguished speakers:

- Professor Dr. Guntima Suwannapong, from the Faculty of Science
- Assoc. Prof. Dr. Pattrawadee Makmee, from the Faculty of Education

The objective of this event was to foster knowledge exchange and enhance participants’ capacity in crafting professional research proposals aimed at securing funding from both national and international agencies.



Participants gained substantial and practical benefits, including:

- A comprehensive understanding of how to structure a research proposal with clarity and strategic focus
- Insights into key criteria and expectations of major funding bodies
- Powerful techniques to make their proposals stand out in competitive review processes

Direct interaction with experts who have firsthand experience in research funding evaluation

This session served as a pivotal step toward empowering graduate students and early-career researchers to strengthen their academic competitiveness and propel their research endeavors onto the global stage.

Graduate School Welcomes Delegates from TAITA and CropLife Asia for Academic Collaboration Toward Sustainable Agriculture



On July 17, 2025, the Graduate School of Burapha University welcomed a high-level delegation from the Thai Agricultural Innovation Trade Association (TAITA) and CropLife Asia, led by Ms. Marie Goh Chooi Fong - Director of Stewardship at CropLife Asia. The discussion focused on academic partnerships and advancing professional capacity in sustainable agriculture across the region.

During the meeting, the Graduate School presented key outcomes from its certified training course, **"Agricultural Hazardous Substance Sales Controller,"** accredited by the Department of Agriculture. As of FY2025, the program has trained **two cohorts with a total of 111 participants**, with results as follows:

- **Batch 1 (Bangsaen):** 69 trainees, 59 certified (85.50% passing rate)
- **Batch 2 (Bangsaen):** 42 trainees, 31 certified (73.81% passing rate)

This initiative is part of a public-private partnership with TAITA and private-sector stakeholders, aiming to enhance knowledge, safety awareness, and ethical standards among agrochemical sellers - thereby encouraging the responsible and informed use of agricultural inputs

The program aligns with the following United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs):

- **SDG 2: Zero Hunger** - by promoting sustainable and safe agricultural practices that contribute to national food security and productivity
- **SDG 4: Quality Education** - by providing specialized training for professionals in the agricultural sector
- **SDG 12: Responsible Consumption and Production** - by promoting safe, ethical practices in hazardous substance management

Program Impact:

- A significant number of trainees have applied their learning in real-life agricultural contexts
- A strong and growing network of responsible agrochemical sellers has been established
- The program has laid the groundwork for the **upcoming "Smart Input Advisor Program,"** designed to build a nationwide system of trained agricultural input advisors

The Graduate School remains committed to expanding regional and global partnerships to empower graduate students and agricultural professionals with the skills needed for a more resilient and sustainable future in food and farming systems.


