Graduate School Holds the 5/2026 Meeting of the Graduate Integrated Curriculum Design Committee to Advance the Development of the Concept Proposal for a New University Program



The Graduate School, Burapha University, held the 5/2026 Meeting of the Graduate Integrated Curriculum Design Committee on 12 June 2026 at Meeting Room 702, Graduate School Office. The purpose of the meeting was to determine the direction and establish a framework for systematically designing the overall process of developing Burapha University's integrated graduate program curriculum.

The meeting focused on preparing a Memorandum of Agreement (MOA), determining details of remuneration related to the program, and jointly calculating the program's break-even point. These efforts will support revisions to the conceptual proposal document that will subsequently be submitted to the Academic Council for consideration. In addition, the participating units were requested to nominate personnel for appointment to the curriculum drafting committee for the proposed Master of Science Program in Integrated Healthcare Management and Business Innovation (New Curriculum, B.E. 2027).

This meeting followed earlier consultative discussions in which the Graduate School collaborated with four faculties—the Faculty of Allied Health Sciences, the International College, the Faculty of Public Health, and the Faculty of Logistics—to exchange ideas and develop the concept of a bilingual integrated master's degree program in the Master of Science (MSc) group. The program is designed to integrate knowledge across multiple disciplines and to enhance both in-depth expertise and interdisciplinary competencies of learners, in alignment with contemporary economic, social, and technological contexts.

Graduate School, Burapha University Transfers Research-Based Knowledge on Durian Diseases to Promote Safe Agriculture in the Eastern Region



The Graduate School, Burapha University organized the training program "Responsible Persons for the Sale of Agricultural Hazardous Substances 2026," Batch 1, during 26-27 June 2026 at Burapha University, Chonburi Province. The program aimed to strengthen the knowledge and capacity of entrepreneurs, responsible persons for the sale of agricultural hazardous substances, and relevant stakeholders, enabling them to work in accordance with academic principles, legal requirements, and safety standards. The program was attended by 64 participants.

A key activity was a special online lecture entitled "Using the Right Substance for the Right Disease: Burapha University's Research on Durian Diseases and the Promotion of Safe Agriculture in the Eastern Region," delivered by Dr. Pavinee Suttiviriya, Burapha University, an expert in plant diseases, plant disease management, and agricultural innovation.



The lecture provided a platform for transferring research-based knowledge from the university to practical users, particularly in the diagnosis and management of major durian diseases such as Fusarium and Phytophthora. It emphasized the appropriate, safe, and responsible use of agricultural substances according to disease types, while introducing biological products and natural extracts as sustainable alternatives for plant disease management.

This initiative reflects the role of the Graduate School as a mechanism for technology transfer from university research to real-world practice. By connecting researchers, entrepreneurs, and agricultural stakeholders in the Eastern Region, the program supports the practical utilization of university research, promotes safe agriculture, and advances the responsible and sustainable use of agricultural technologies.

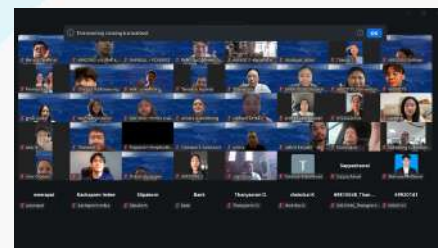
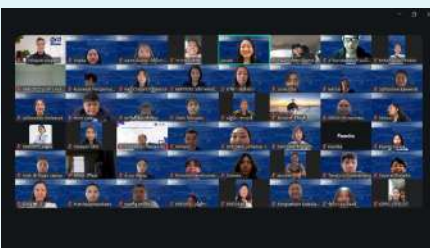
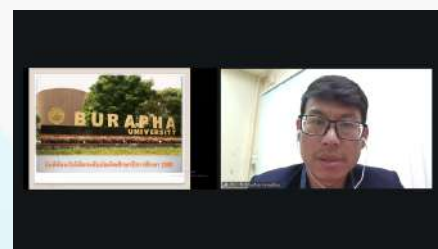
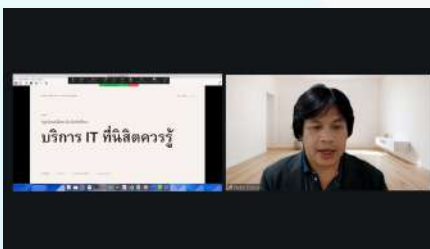
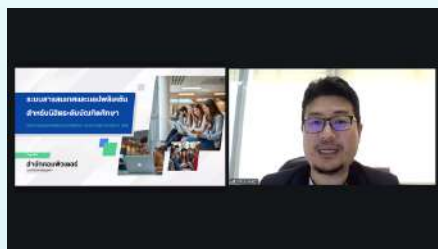

Orientation Program for New Graduate Students, First Semester, Academic Year 2026



On 27 June 2026, the Graduate School of Burapha University organized the Orientation Program for New Graduate Students enrolled in the Graduate Diploma and Higher Graduate Diploma programs for the First Semester of the 2026 Academic Year. The orientation was conducted online via Zoom Meeting and streamed live through the Graduate School's YouTube channel.

The opening ceremony was graciously presided over by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Watcharin Gasalak, President of Burapha University, who delivered the opening remarks. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Witawat Jangiam, Dean of the Graduate School, warmly welcomed the new graduate students.

The program also featured an informative session by Asst. Prof. Dr. Montana Rungsiyopas, Vice-Dean for Academic Affairs, who provided an overview of the curriculum standards, university regulations, announcements, policies, and guidelines that graduate students should be familiar with.

In addition, representatives from the Computer Center, who introduced the University's information technology and digital services; representatives from the University Library, who provided information on library services and research database resources for academic study and research; and representatives from the Office of the Registrar, who explained the use of the University's academic registration system, including course registration procedures and other related registration services.

For the First Semester of the 2026 Academic Year, Burapha University welcomed a total of 706 new graduate students, comprising 71 doctoral students, 558 master's students, 51 Graduate Diploma students, and 26 Higher Graduate Diploma students.
