Graduate School and Computer Center Collaborate on the Development of GRD-Forms Phase 3: Process Pathways for Graduate Students and Graduation Document Submission



On 9 July 2026, the Graduate School, Burapha University, led by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Witawat Jangiam, Dean of the Graduate School, and Asst. Prof. Dr. Montana Rungsiyopas, Vice-Dean for Academic Affairs, together with Graduate School staff, held a meeting with the Computer Center, led by Deputy Director for Information Systems and Innovation Development, along with Computer Center staff, to discuss guidelines for the development of GRD-Forms Phase 3. The meeting was held at Meeting Room QS1-200, 2nd Floor, Queen Sirikit Building 1 (QS1), Graduate School Office, Burapha University.

GRD-Forms Phase 3 is being developed to support process pathways related to graduate students throughout their academic journey, from the beginning of their studies until the stage prior to graduation (GRD-Journey). The system also includes a thesis progress reporting form (GRD- Progress Report) and an online document submission system for graduate students applying for graduation (GRD-Exit).

This new system is part of an effort to enhance administrative efficiency by reducing paper-based documentation and improving the speed of service delivery through a more systematic, streamlined, and traceable process.

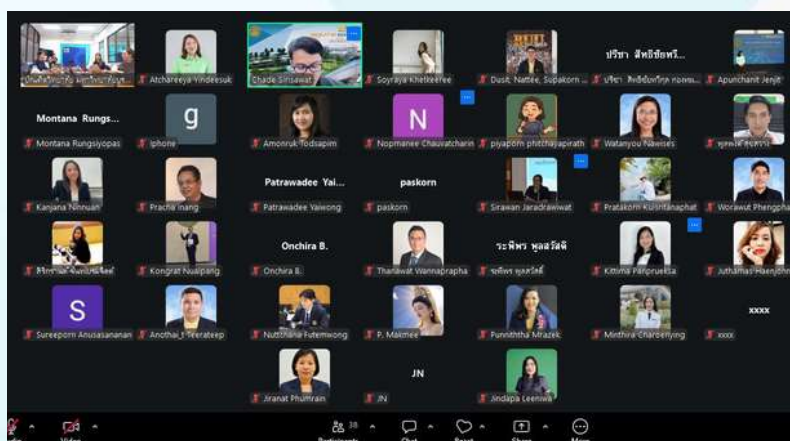

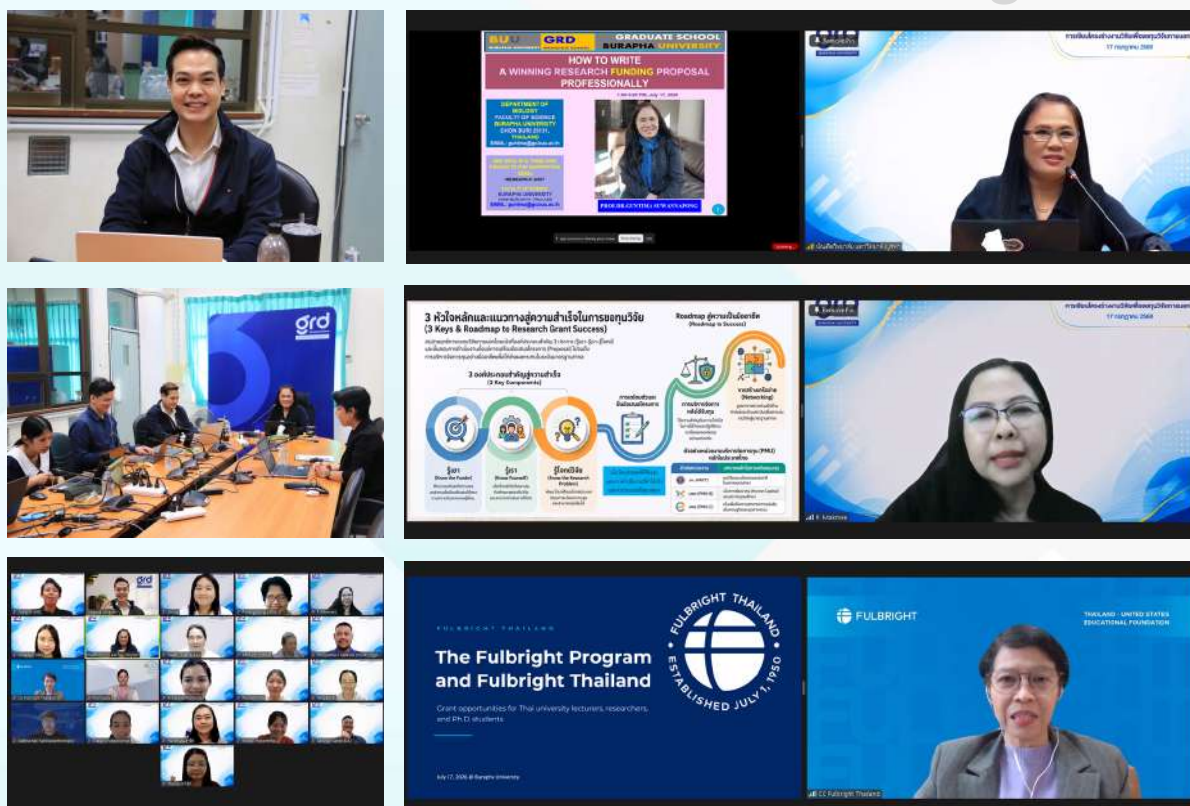

The submitted grades also serve as official information for the Graduate School to verify students' academic records and graduation eligibility in accordance with the University's requirements. The meeting was attended by a total of 46 faculty members and staff.

Graduate School, Burapha University Organizes Workshop on Research Proposal Writing for External Research Funding



On 17 July 2026, the Graduate School, Burapha University organized the GRD Canvas: Paint Your Research Masterpiece program under the theme "Research Proposal Writing for External Research Funding" via Zoom Meeting. The event was officially opened with welcoming remarks by Assoc. Prof. Dr. Witawat Jangiam, Dean of the Graduate School. The workshop featured three distinguished speakers:

1. Professor Dr. Guntima Suwannapong, Faculty of Science, Burapha University
2. Assoc. Prof. Dr. Pattrawadee Makmee, Faculty of Education, Burapha University
3. Ms. Chotima Chaitiamwong, Thailand-United States Educational Foundation (Fulbright)

The program was designed to enhance participants' knowledge, promote the exchange of experiences, and develop professional skills in research proposal writing. It focused on preparing researchers to successfully apply for research funding from both national and international funding agencies. Participants gained a clear understanding of the concepts and strategies for structuring competitive research proposals, learned about the requirements and key priorities of various funding organizations, and had the opportunity to exchange perspectives with distinguished speakers who possess extensive firsthand experience in research grant evaluation. The lecture was attended by a total of 86 participants.
